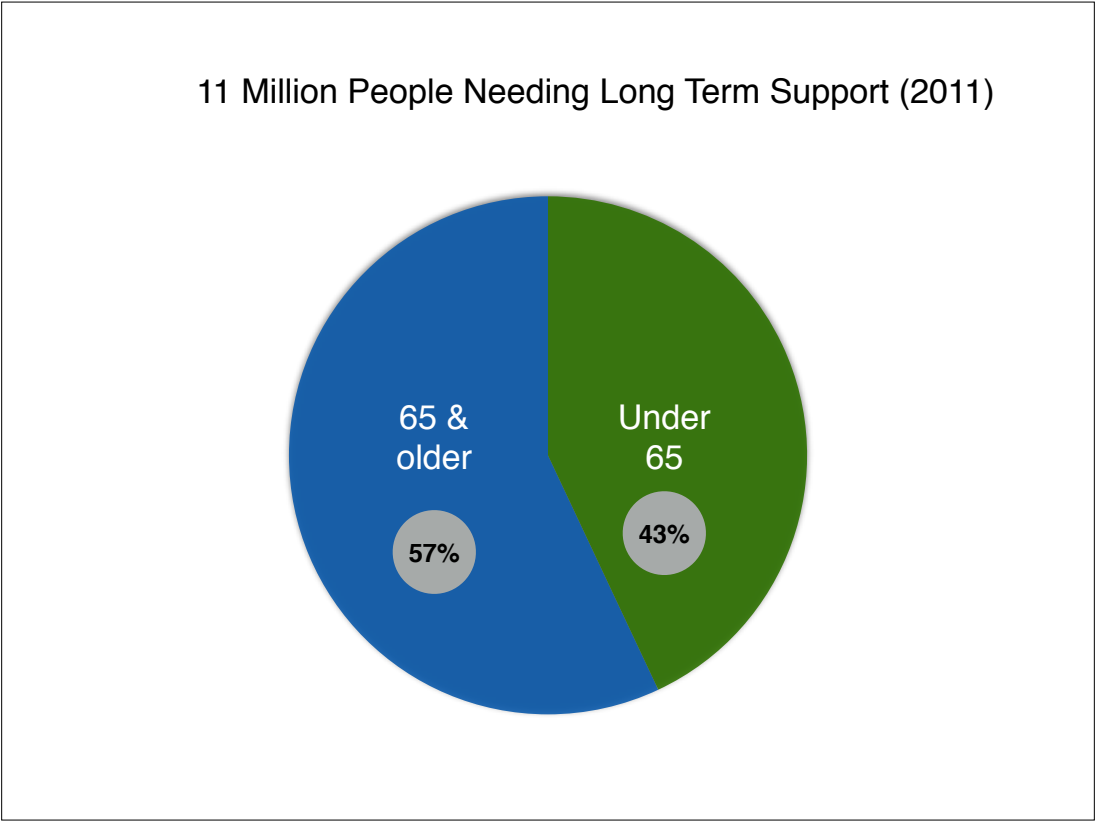
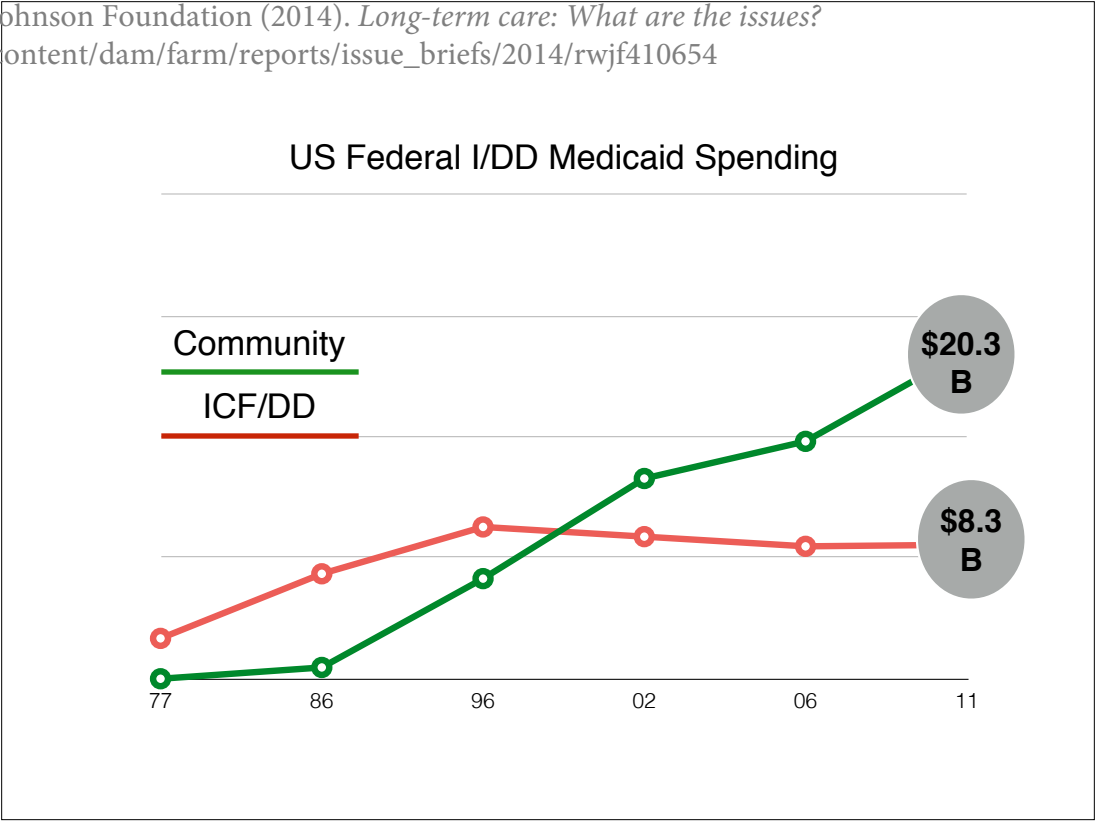
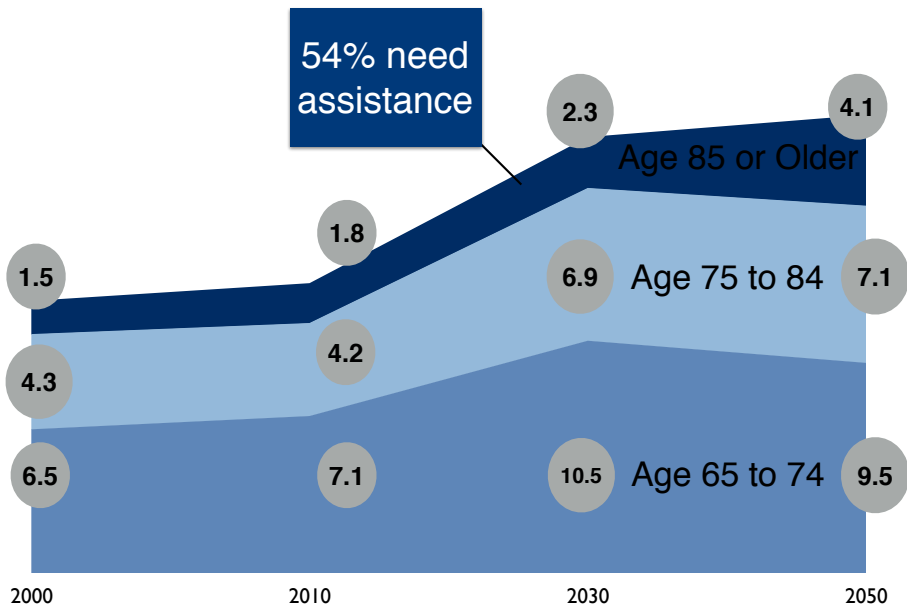


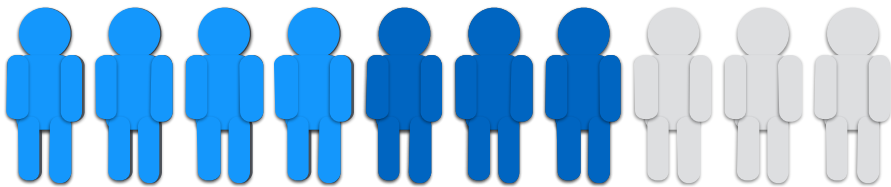

Elderly Adults As a Share of US Population



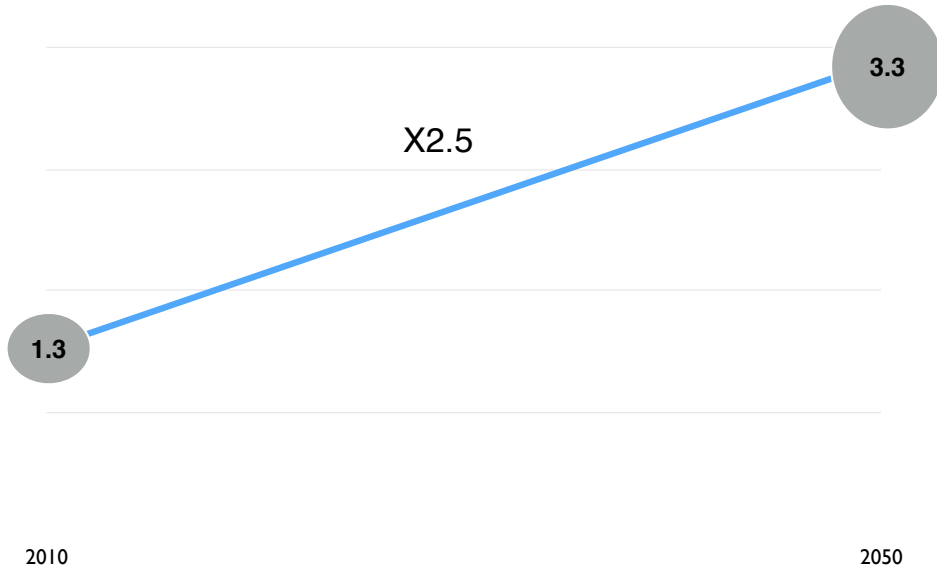

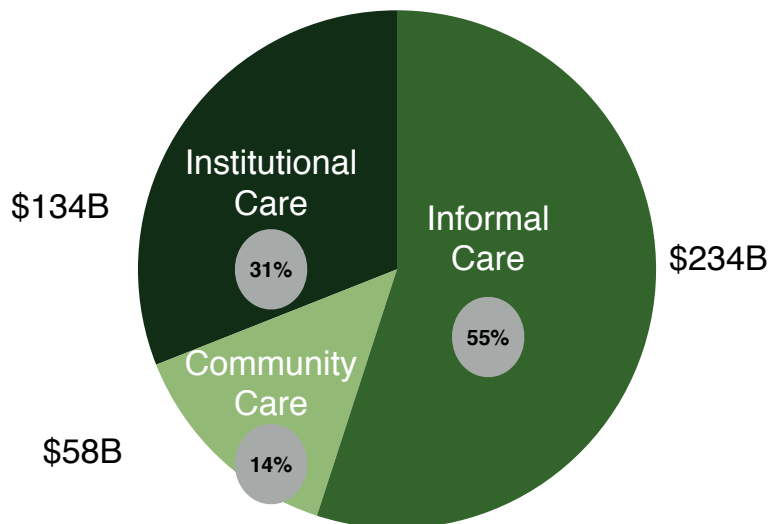

Future Spending for Long Term Supports for Elders % of GDP

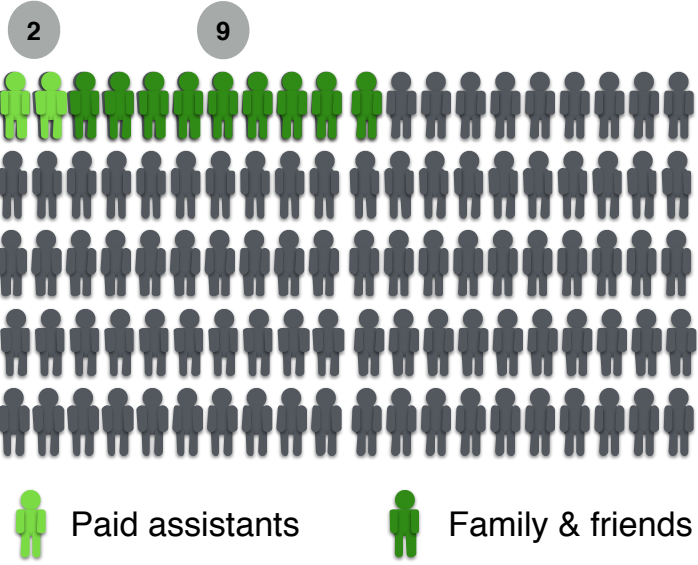


Economic Value of Formal & Informal Supports for Elders (2011)

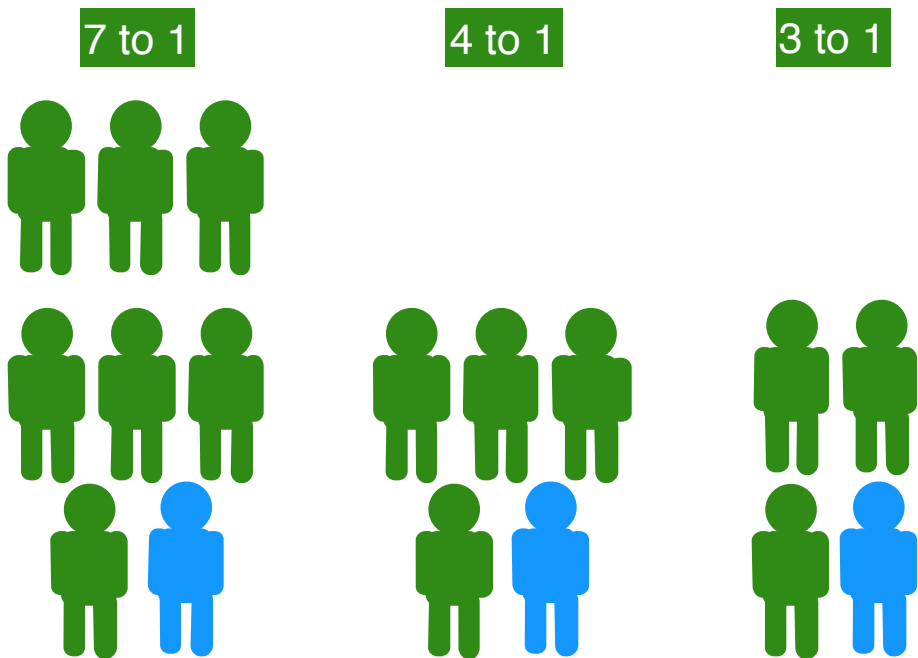


% of Adult Population Needed to Assist Elders Living in Community

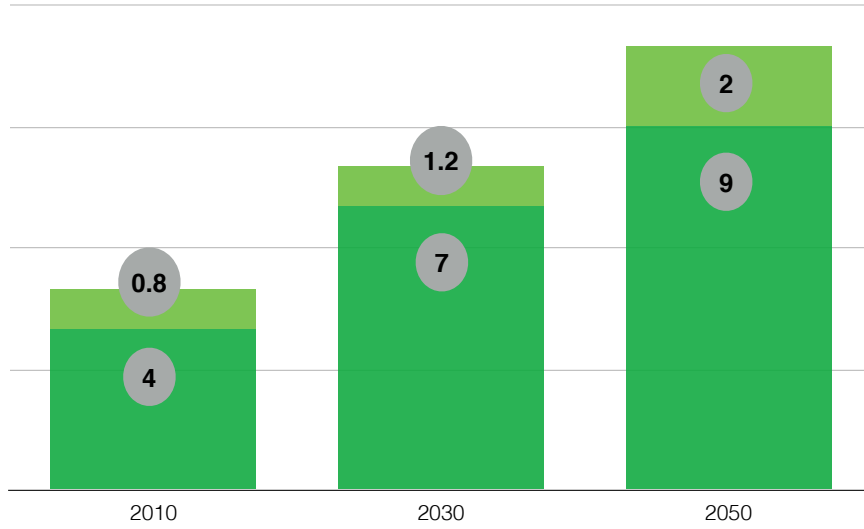
